Volunteer Role: Title	Social Sport Volunteer - Walking Netball Facilitator

Support and Training	Information and ideas regarding the delivery of walking netball. Dementia Awareness training. The volunteer will be supported by the sports hub officer while volunteering.
Expectations	 Volunteers are expected to: Carry out tasks to meet the purpose and values of Edinburgh Leisure in line with the volunteer policy and agreement. Volunteer within agreed guidelines and remits. Respect confidentiality and the human rights of others. Respect other volunteers, service users and staff. Have regard for the health and safety of others.
Commitment	Attend walking netball sessions every week, lasting 1 hour. In addition, be onsite 15 minutes before the start of the session and afterwards for a 30-minute 'social' element.
